"in power," must learn to set others free. I can perhaps say that I am "in power," being the President of APTS. It is important that I do not see my power as a means of control.

When we set people free, "faith, hope and love" are being exercised. I am having **FAITH** in God and in people when I release people from my control to God's control. I am also expanding my **HOPE** and expectations. It is no longer just what I can do or what God can do in me. The circle of expectations have moved beyond me to cover another person that I have set free. True **LOVE** is never exercised by self-centered control. A genuine love relationship can only take place in an environment of freedom.

We must NOT put people under bondage to our personal biases. As our students mature, they must become free to minister as the Lord leads them. In fact, our theology of the Divine Call requires us to release people to answer God's call themselves.
